Evidence and guidance on how to include youth with disabilities



UNICEF is an organisation that helps children across the world.

Last summer, UNICEF looked into whether 8 countries in South Asia included people with disabilities in education.

UNICEF say that it is important to include the rights of children with disability in laws and polcies.

The African Education Research Database found that only a small number of young people with disabilities, particularly women, went to practical job skills training.

Schools need to think about the needs of young people with disabilities so that they can go to practical job skills training.



A study by the Economic and Social Research Council looked at the best ways to interview children and youth with disabilities.

One of the best ways is to prepare well for each person's needs.







A review of **research** done on the **sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR)** of youth with intellectual disabilities found examples good work.

The research found the 2 best ways to make sure young people with intellectual disabilities can make their own choices about their bodies, relationships, sex and having children:

- 1. Support from friends and family.
- 2. Education about sex and relationships.


Research about **sexual and reproductive health and rights** (SRHR) services in schools for youth with disabilities in Ghana was released.













Youth with disabilities face barriers to access **SRHR**:

- Healthcare facilities are difficult to access.
- People at healthcare facilities do not know how to use sign language.

The Global Disability Youth Summit 2022 created a call for action in order to better include youth with disabilities.

They focused on access to education and **social protection**.

A conference on the impact of **COVID-19** on youth with disabilities was held recently.

The conference looked at how young people with disabilities experienced **COVID-19** in multiple countries such as Nepal, Uganda, England and Peru.

The African Union released guidelines for organisations on how to better include youth with disabilities in exchange programs.

Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) is about people making their own choices about their bodies, relationships, sex and having children.


