



Discussion about including people with disabilities in health systems



The World Health Organisation (WHO) is an organisation that is responsible for **public health** across the world.




Public health is about helping people to stay healthy and protecting them from things that threaten their health.



A person working for the WHO recently answered questions about **public health** and people with disabilities.



Governments agreed with the WHO to make disability inclusion in public health better.



They said that **COVID-19** had a bigger impact on people with disabilities.





Although there isn't any country in the world that has fully included people with disabilities in their health sector, there are good examples.



One example is a small Pacific Island that trains their healthcare staff on stigma and discrimination.



The WHO also started of discussions between **organisations of persons** with disabilities and health groups.



This will help improve the inclusion of people with disabilities in the health sector.

Evidence and guidance on how to include people with disabilities in health systems



Research was done on policy documents from health programs in Bangladesh and Cambodia.



The study found that the policies did not recognize many of the issues facing people with disabilities or women and children.



Another study looked at the reasons why **COVID-19** had a bigger impact on people with disbailities.



It found that the risks of **COVID-19** were higher for people with disabilities who live in residential or long-term care facilities.



A study found that health care facilities in Brazil are difficult for people with disbailities to access.

Humanity and Inlcusion published what they learned about trying to include people with disbailties in sexual and reproductive health services.

The main lessons are:














- 1. Governments should use **data** on people with disabilities to make their services more accessible.
- 2. Working with **organisations of persons with disabilities** is a good
 way to help people with
 disabilities access services.
- 3. It is important to share accurate and accessible information.

A study found that disability is linked to loneliness in 8 countries.

A few other reports published information about how people with disabilities were excluded from education, health, and jobs.

Another report looked at the challeneges and barriers young women with disabilities in Nepal faced in accessing menstrual hygeine products.

Programme changed their
activities to deal with the impact of **COVID-19** on people with
disabilities and mental health
conditions.




The program found that mental health workers did not receive any training on how to work safely during the **COVID-19 pandemic.**



The program organised a training for health workers which helped them understand the risks of **COVID-19** and how to manage them safely.
